

Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) Scholarship

The University of Nairobi, Kenya and Sokoine University of Agriculture, Tanzania through a Research Grant from the World Association for Advancement of Veterinary Parasitology, Africa Network (WAAVP-AN) under the African Capacity Building Foundation is providing one (1) PhD scholarship in Veterinary Pathobiology (Parasitology Option). The successful candidate will register in the Department of Veterinary Pathology, Microbiology and Parasitology, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Nairobi. The aim of the scholarship is to build capacity in control of coccidiosis in chickens in Kenya and Tanzania.

The scholarship includes payment of tuition fee, research project materials and data collection expenses and a living stipend. The scholarship is strictly tenable for **three (3)** consecutive years and eligible candidates are invited to apply.

Eligibility:

Common regulations for the degree of doctor of philosophy of the University of Nairobi shall apply. In addition, candidates must meet the following minimum requirements:

- 1) Be a holders of the following degree awards of the University of Nairobi or a University recognized by the senate of the University of Nairobi:
 - a) Master of Science in Applied Veterinary Parasitology
 - b) Master of Science in Applied Parasitology
 - c) Master of Science in Veterinary Pathology, Microbiology and Parasitology
 - d) Master of Science in Veterinary Parasitology
 - e) Master of Science in Biomedical Science
- 2) Any other Master's degree equivalent to the above from a University recognized by the Senate of the University of Nairobi

Interested candidates should send in their applications to undersigned by **May 26, 2025**.

- Applicants should email their application letters (1 page) highlighting their suitability for the advertised position above, certified copies of bachelor's and master's degree certificates and transcripts, and curriculum vitae (CV) giving details of their qualifications, experience and three (3) referees, as well as indicating their telephone and e-mail contacts
